In this workshop, participants will explore multicultures, describe its effects on interpretations and its assessment, and best practices for interpreting of Deaf consumers. Lack of multicultural in interpreting can affect our understanding, actions, decision making without us being consciously aware, and go on to influence and create inequalities in our systems. Through discussion and activities, participants will learn how to become more culturally responsive and promote equity in a society that is more racially and ethnically diverse. Participants will examine challenges and work on interpreting by using strategies, and techniques and enabling them to adopt an equity-centered approach for serving individuals and communities from various racially, ethnically, and socioeconomically diverse backgrounds.



Dr. Jenny Gough (she/her/hers) is a Department Chair and professor in the American Sign Language program at Berkeley City College. She also teaches interpreting courses at numerous colleges and universities. She is the Vice President of the Conference of Interpreter Trainers (CIT).
